In response to collaborative advocacy initiatives from several prostate cancer organizations along with individual survivors and caregivers, the Fiscal Year 2016 Department of Defense Appropriations Act has allocated [\\$80 million for prostate cancer research](#) funding for peer reviewed programs managed by the Department of Defense office of Congressionally Directed Medical Research Programs (CDMRP).

Men diagnosed with low-grade prostate cancer are encouraged to [participate in "The Dashboard Study for Prostate Cancer,"](#) a project to design, test and implement an interactive, multi-media decision aid as an electronic clinical decision dashboard to improve the quality of clinical decision making for the initial treatment of patients with low-risk prostate cancer. The study is being conducted by the Clinical Research Center of the University of Rochester Clinical and Translational Science Institute for a special interest project sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control. Applications are now being accepted for the [Survivor Advocate Program](#), which provides scholarships for up to 20 advocates to attend the [8th Biennial Cancer Survivorship Research Conference](#), "Innovation in a Rapidly Changing Landscape," June 16-18, 2016, at the Omni Shoreham Hotel in Washington, DC. Advocates will learn first-hand about moving cancer survivorship advances from early-stage research to survivor care, interact with other advocate leaders and researchers, and develop tools to
